FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES

Florida Bright Futures is a state funded program that provides students with the opportunity to earn 100% tuition or 75% tuition based on weighted GPA and SAT/ACT scores. In order to be eligible for the 100% scholarship, students need to perform 100 hours of community service and log it through Profferfish. To be eligible for the 75% scholarship, students must complete 75 community service hours and log these hours into Profferfish.

In addition to students meeting these requirements, students who earn the AICE Diploma are also eligible to receive Florida Bright Futures with completion of 100 service hours. The program is accepted at any Public Florida University. The credit cost can also be translated to the cost of a Private University within the state of Florida, the student would then be responsible for the difference in credit hour cost.



A Voice for Animals Contest

Award: \$250-500

Deadline: May 31, 2022

The contest is supported by a partnership between the Animal Welfare Institute and the Humane Education Network with additional support from the Palo Alto Humane Society.

- Participants must currently be enrolled in middle or high school, or be home-schooled, and less than 19 years of age on January 31, 2022 (the date the contest opened for entries). No exceptions!
- The contest is open to all otherwise eligible students worldwide regardless of nationality, citizenship, or country of residence.

DiGiorgio STEAM Scholarship

Award: \$2,500

Deadline: April 30, 2022

- Applicants must be currently enrolled in a high school (public, charter, private or home school) in any State in the U.S.A., Washington D. C. or Puerto Rico
- Must have a Grade Point Average of 3.5 or higher.
- Must demonstrate financial need and intent to pursue a STEAM Career (college, university, trade school).
- The Valentino DiGiorgio STEAM Scholarship is available to any student meeting the above criteria and having a sincere interest in STEAM.
- Interest can be demonstrated by sharing the student's active involvement in STEAM activities, clubs and extracurricular activities, as well as work experience, internships and projects or innovations the student has completed.

SWEET FEET SCHOLARSHIP

Award: \$10,000

Deadline: Varies

1. Impending Acceptance into a college or university or current student

2. Family income of \$60,000 or less

3. Must have one: Active in the community, volunteers, has a job or plays a sport

4. Must maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher while in school

5. If applying as a high school student, must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher

6. Must be from Florida, Wisconsin or the New England Area to apply (one student in each state will be chosen).

7. All students receiving scholarships from The Sweet Feet Foundation are required to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and are required to do so on an annual basis. The Sweet Feet Foundation will bridge the gap of the remaining funds that FAFSA does not cover for eligible students, removing the financial barrier for students to receive their college education.

Brower Youth Award

Award: \$3,000

Deadline: May 14, 2022

Earth Island Institute established the Brower Youth Awards for Environmental Leadership in 2000 to honor renowned environmental advocate David Brower, who said, "I love to see what young people can do, before someone old tells them it's impossible." It is with this spirit that we recognize the outstanding leadership efforts of young people who are working for the protection of our shared planet.

- Youth environmental change leaders ages 13 to 22 (as of May 14, 2022) living in North America (including Mexico, Canada, and some Caribbean Islands) and U.S. territories are encouraged to apply.

Each of the six recipients of the Brower Youth Awards will receive a \$3,000 cash prize, a professionally produced short film about their work from an Emmy Award-winning film crew, and flight and lodging accommodations for a weeklong trip to the San Francisco Bay Area.

During their stay in California, the recipients will participate in leadership activities and workshops on coaching, visioning, public speaking and developing media relations. The week of activities culminates in the awards ceremony. The Brower Youth Awards program invests in the winners' continued success by providing ongoing access to resources, mentors, and opportunities to develop leadership skills.

The Print and Graphics Scholarship Foundation was organized in 1956 by concerned industry leaders as a nonprofit, private, industry-directed corporation to develop and dispense scholarship and fellow assistance to talented young people who are interested in graphic communications careers.

- Two recommendations are required. Simply enter their email address and we will contact them for you. (Please give your referral enough time to submit before the application site closes).
- Your official transcripts or a copy of your official transcripts must be submitted through the application site or sent to PGSF.
- You must have a 3.0 GPA or better.
- A full-time status. (Full-time status defined as someone who is registered in 12 or more credits per term)
- A student who is, or will be, enrolled in a printing or graphics program at a technical school, college or university within the United States.
- The student must be pursuing a career in printing technology, printing management, graphic communication, packaging, or publishing.
- Scholarships are not awarded for part-time study or for online-only program

(ISC)² Undergraduate Cybersecurity Scholarship

Award: \$5,000

Deadline: March 8, 2022

1. Must be pursuing, or plan to pursue, a degree with a focus on cybersecurity or information assurance.
2. You may be a senior in high school or an undergraduate student who is currently a junior, freshman, sophomore or senior who will be pursuing an undergraduate degree in the fall.
3. A minimum 3.3 GPA is required.
Recipients are notified in June.

Shawn Carter Scholarship Foundation

Award: \$2,500

Deadline: April 30, 2022

The Shawn Carter Scholarship Fund (SCSF) was founded on the belief that any motivated individual in need should have the opportunity to further his or her education. By removing some of the financial burdens associated with going to, surviving in, and graduating from college, the SCSF plays a vital role in increasing college access and success for many motivated yet under-served youth and young adults. The SCSF provides individual grants, paid directly to the educational institution, to every student who qualifies and reapplies yearly, from admission to graduation. The grant can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books, lab fees, travel and select costs of living. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to "give back" by conducting community service and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carter Scholars.

To be eligible for the Shawn Carter Scholarship, students must be pursuing their first undergraduate degree who are high school seniors, students with GED diplomas or students enrolled in 2-year or 4-year undergraduate programs or vocational or trade schools. Must be US citizen or Permanent Resident who is 25 years old or younger with a minimum 2.0 GPA and annual household income not exceeding \$75,000.
