FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES

Florida Bright Futures is a state funded program that provides students with the opportunity to earn 100% tuition or 75% tuition based on weighted GPA and SAT/ACT scores. In order to be eligible for the 100% scholarship, students need to perform 100 hours of community service and log it through Profferfish. To be eligible for the 75% scholarship, students must complete 75 community service hours and log these hours into Profferfish.

In addition to students meeting these requirements, students who earn the AICE Diploma are also eligible to receive Florida Bright Futures with completion of 100 service hours. The program is accepted at any Public Florida University. The credit cost can also be translated to the cost of a Private University within the state of Florida, the student would then be responsible for the difference in credit hour cost.

AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship

Award: \$5,000

Deadline: February 4, 2022

The American Meteorological Society offers the AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship program, open to all high school students, designed to encourage study in the atmospheric and related sciences.

- Eligible applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents entering their freshman year of college in the autumn following the distribution of the award
- Must be planning to pursue a degree in the atmospheric or related oceanic or hydrologic sciences. Marine biology does not meet this requirement.
- A minimum 3.0 GPA is also required

DiGiorgio STEAM Scholarship

Award: \$2,500

Deadline: April 30, 2022

- Applicants must be currently enrolled in a high school (public, charter, private or home school) in any State in the U.S.A., Washington D. C. or Puerto Rico
- Must have a Grade Point Average of 3.5 or higher.
- Must demonstrate financial need and intent to pursue a STEAM Career (college, university, trade school).
- The Valentino DiGiorgio STEAM Scholarship is available to any student meeting the above criteria and having a sincere interest in STEAM.
- Interest can be demonstrated by sharing the student's active involvement in STEAM activities, clubs and extracurricular activities, as well as work experience, internships and projects or innovations the student has completed.

Deadline: February 1, 2022

Deadline: February 15, 2022

AFA's Teens for Alzheimer's Awareness College Scholarship Essay Contest is an annual competition for college-bound high school seniors. Applicants are asked to write a 1,200 to 1,500-word essay that describes the impact of Alzheimer's disease on themselves, their families or their communities, and what they have learned in light of coping with the brain disorder. The grand prize winner receives \$5,000, with additional prizes awarded for runners up

Automotive Aftermarket Scholarships

Award: \$5,000

Deadline: March 31, 2022

Automotive Aftermarket Scholarships works with thirty other organizations who also award automotive scholarships to full-time students training for automotive careers as technicians or in business, engineering, etc. Students must be attending or be high school graduating seniors planning to attend an accredited college or university or any ASE/NATEF certified post-secondary school for automotive mechanical, collision, or heavy duty training.

Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship Program

Award: \$10,000

Deadline: February 17, 2022

Applicants to the Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship Program must be:

- Be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
- Be high school seniors who are currently enrolled in or who have completed a high school or college dual degree course where computer science is the subject. Example courses include:
 - International Baccalaureate Computer
 Science Course
 - Advanced Placement (AP) Computer
 Science A or Advanced Placement (AP)
 Computer Science Principles
 - Computer science through a college dual enrollment program
 - Other High School course where only Computer Science is taught
- Be planning to attain a bachelor's degree in computer science, software engineering, computer engineering or other computer science related field of study from an accredited 4-year college or from a 2-year college with the intent to transfer to a 4-year college.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent).

Employees of Amazon and subsidiaries and members of their immediate family are not eligible to apply.

Shawn Carter Scholarship Foundation

Award: \$2,500 **Deadline: April 30, 2022**

The Shawn Carter Scholarship Fund (SCSF) was founded on the belief that any motivated individual in need should have the opportunity to further his or her education. By removing some of the financial burdens associated with going to, surviving in, and graduating from college, the SCSF plays a vital role in increasing college access and success for many motivated yet under-served youth and young adults. The SCSF provides individual grants, paid directly to the educational institution, to every student who qualifies and reapplies yearly, from admission to graduation. The grant can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books, lab fees, travel and select costs of living. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to "give back" by conducting community service and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carter Scholars.

To be eligible for the Shawn Carter Scholarship, students must be pursuing their first undergraduate degree who are high school seniors, students with GED diplomas or students enrolled in 2-year or 4-year undergraduate programs or vocational or trade schools. Must be US citizen or Permanent Resident who is 25 years old or younger with a minimum 2.0 GPA and annual household income not exceeding \$75,000.
